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Coastal Zone Management

- The mission of the Virginia Coastal Zone Management Program is to protect and manage Virginia's coastal zone.
- Goals of the VCZMP cover the sustainable use and protection of coastal resources, as well as coordination between agencies, interest groups, and citizens.





Coastal Zone Management

- HRPDC's Coastal Zone Management efforts include both ongoing and term-limited programs
 - Technical Assistance Program
 - Regional Coordination
 - Environmental Impact Review
 - Public Information and Education
 - Local Government Staff Training
 - Technical Studies
 - Technical Assistance
 - Focal Area grants are awarded to support projects in topics designated by the Coastal Policy Team
 - Current grants for coastal resiliency and water quality policy analysis
 - Section 309 grants are awarded to support the development of implementable policies or program enhancement
 - Current grant for policy research and development to improve land and water quality



Coastal Zone Management

- Technical Studies on local and regional issues
- Technical Assistance to local governments
- Regional coordination with staff from local governments, state and federal agencies, and non-governmental stakeholders

New Federal Facilities Map




The federal government maintains a significant presence in Hampton Roads, as depicted on this map created by the Hampton Roads Planning District Commission (HRPDC). The largest federal land owner in Hampton Roads is the US Fish and Wildlife Service. There are five National Wildlife Refuges in the region totaling approximately 165 square miles. The next largest federal land owner is the US Department of Defense with approximately 94 square miles of properties.

Altogether, there are approximately 272 square miles of land owned by multiple federal agencies which accounts for about 9% of the total area represented by HRPDC localities.

The map was developed in partnership with the Hampton Roads Military and Federal Facilities Alliance (HRMFFA).
